

## Currently Approved Option II Programs

### A. School/District-Wide Committee

Students in grades 9-12 who participate on School/District-wide committees with a membership that consists of a broad segment of the school community (teachers, administrators, parents, community members), will be eligible to receive high school credit in Civics. The credit will be viewed as “elective credit” within Social Studies.

### B. Work Experiences

Students in 12<sup>th</sup> grade electing courses in career education should demonstrate both teamwork and problem-solving skills through a structured learning experience. This could consist of an experiential, supervised educational activity designed to provide students with exposure to the requirements and responsibilities of specific job titles or job groupings, and to assist them in gaining employment skills and making career and educational choices. Examples include, but are not limited to: apprenticeships, cooperative education, school-based experiences, and paid employment. Structured learning experiences must meet all state and federal child labor laws and regulations.

### C. Junior High School/Pre-High School Program

Students enrolled in high school level courses can elect to receive credit toward graduation and toward the fulfillment of the graduation requirement in that specific area. The Woodbury Board of Education has approved the following courses for Option II credit:

1. Accelerated Mathematics (8)
2. Spanish I (8)
3. Chinese I (8)

### D. “O” Period Course Offerings

Students can elect to enroll in courses offered through Gloucester County College prior to the start of the official school day on the Woodbury High School campus. College credit and high school credit will be awarded. Courses will rotate according to the following schedule:

1. 2008-2009 Introduction to Psychology (semester 1) Abnormal Psychology (semester 2)
2. 2009-2010 Introduction to Sociology (semester 1) Sociology II (semester 2)

### E. Independent Experiences

Students can explore alternative methods within the community, at post secondary schools, and/or online to demonstrate proficiency in meeting the New Jersey Core Content Standards in specific areas. Students will need to correlate the outside learning to the established standards in the given area and gain approval prior to starting the experience.
