**ANNUAL INTERGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT NOTICE
FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2010-2011
SCHOOL IPM**

Dear Parent, Guardian or Staff Member:

This notice is being distributed to comply with the New Jersey School Integrated Pest Management Act. Woodbury City Public School has adopted an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Policy and has implemented an IPM Plan to comply with this law. IPM is a holistic, preventative approach to managing pests that is explained further in the school IPM Policy included with this notice.

All schools in New Jersey are required to have an Integrated Pest Management coordinator (IPM Coordinator) to oversee all activities related to IPM and pesticide use at the school.

The IPM Coordinator maintains the pesticide product label and the Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) (when one is available), of each pesticide product that may be used on school property. The label and the MSDS are available for review by a parent, guardian, staff member or student attending the school. Also, the IPM Coordinator is available to parents, guardians and staff members for information and to discuss comments about IPM activities and pesticide use at the school.

As part of a school pest management plan Woodbury City Public Schools may use pesticides to control pests. The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) register pesticides to determine that the use of a pesticide in accordance with instructions printed on the label does not pose an unreasonable risk to human health and the environment. Nevertheless, the EPA and the DEP cannot guarantee that registered pesticides do not pose any risk to human health, thus unnecessary exposure to pesticides do not pose any risk to human health, thus unnecessary exposure to pesticides should be avoided. The EPA has issued the statement that, where possible, persons who are potentially sensitive, such as pregnant women, infants and children should avoid unnecessary pesticide exposure.

Please be advised the following list of low impact products may be used during the school year. These items are typically used to control insects and mice. The products listed are all low impact methods used by our in-house IPM Coordinator. All MSDS sheets are located at each building.

Interior Chemical Treatment (as needed all district buildings)

- **Delta Dust**
- **Advion Ant Bait Gel**
- **Final Blox Mouse Bait**
- **Pre Empt Roach Gel Bait**

The following products are used by our in-house IPM Coordinator listed by location:

High School Football Complex/Francis Avenue Sports Complex/High School
Front Lawn

- **Trimec Plus** – crabgrass post emergent (liquid)
- **Sedgehammer** – post emergent nut sedge control (liquid)
- **Dimension** – pre emergent crabgrass control (granules)
- **Surge** – post emergent crabgrass control (granules)

The following products are used in the following locations

District Flower beds, tree rings, stadium hillside

- **Snap Shot** – granular weed pre-emergent- spring
- **Round up pro** – post emergent weed control- summer

Tennis courts, fences, sidewalks, curbs
