Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. was founded at Howard University on January 16, 1920. It is a professional non-profit organization incorporated under the laws of the District of Columbia. Zeta has over 100,000 members throughout America, West Africa, West Germany, Bahamas Islands, Virgin Islands, South Korea and Italy. The sorority's ideals and objectives are scholarship, service, sisterly love and finer womanhood.

Omicron Omicron Zeta Chapter of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. serves the communities in Gloucester County, New Jersey. The chapter sponsors the Stork's Nest, a prenatal program. The Nest provides educational workshops and free baby items to mothers who attend the program. The Amicae, one of the sorority's auxiliary groups are women who assist and support the ideals of the sorority. These women promote public relations among Zetas and other women in the county. Omicron Omicron Zeta chapter also supports three youth groups. The Archonettes who are high school students, the Amicettes, 9-12 year olds and the Pearlettes, girls 6-8 years old. The youth groups provide service and sisterhood to girls in the Gloucester County community.

### Guidelines for Scholarship Applicants

Applicant must be a female African American senior who attends high school in Gloucester County, or a member of the chapter's Archonette youth group for two years. Applicant must be planning to attend an accredited four year college or university in the fall of 2012.

Awards will be based on academic achievement, involvement in school activities, character, leadership, community/volunteer service and career goals. Applications will be judged by the Scholarship Committee of Omicron Omicron Zeta Chapter.

**Items Needed:** A completed application consists of the application provided, an official school transcript, two letters of reference and an essay. Only completed applications will be considered.

**Requirement:** Recipients are required to attend the Sorority's Scholarship Awards Brunch for the formal scholarship presentation on April 21, 2012 at 11:30 AM. Recipients are also encouraged to purchase at least one ad for the souvenir journal.

**Award/Proof of Enrollment:** The scholarship is in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1000.00). Recipient must show proof of enrollment by December 31, 2012 in an accredited college or university before scholarship money is released.

**Deadline for submitting applications is February 15, 2012.** Scholarship recipients will be notified by March 1, 2012. Mailed complete application to:
