Dear Class of 2009 and Parents/Guardians:

We hope your senior year is the best year ever! This is the first in a series of bulletins that the Counseling office will publish. Each bulletin will contain a section on college visits, open houses, special notes, and general scholarships that can be used at any school. If you need more information about any of the listings or applications, please see Mrs. Davis or Mr. Howey.

Begin to complete your college applications NOW! If you have not already done so, narrow your college/post secondary school selections to approximately five schools. Be sure your list includes a school you truly wish to attend, even though you may be reaching, and a school to which there is little doubt of you being accepted. Again this year, we will be scheduling individual meetings with seniors and their parents to discuss each student's post graduation plans. Please contact Mrs. Rivera at 853-0123 ext. 387 to schedule your appointment. Both daytime and evening appointments are available during the month of October. Evening appointments are available on October 14, 16, 21 and 23, 2008 from 3:00 PM through 7:00 PM. We do understand that college is not for everyone, and there are many other options for students who do not plan to attend college. As we meet with seniors and their parents, we will give each student a packet with numerous publications that will be helpful to you. Again this year we are extremely fortunate to have access to the computer program, *BRIDGES*. This program is designed to help students with career/college choices. Some students have already had the opportunity to work with the *BRIDGES* program, and the feedback has been very positive.

Upon completing your college applications, please bring them to the counseling office along with your application fee and three stamps (per application). The following items can be included in your application packet: teacher recommendations, copies of awards, certificates, newspaper articles and your list of activities. We will process the application and mail the packet along with your transcript to the college/post secondary school for you. It takes 10 school days to process your application after we receive all pieces. If applying electronically, please be sure to make us aware so that your application can be completed with transcripts and recommendations. **IF THE COLLEGE YOU ARE APPLYING TO HAS A DEADLINE OF JANUARY 1-10, YOUR APPLICATION MUST BE TURNED INTO THE COUNSELING OFFICE BY TUESDAY, DECEMBER 9, 2008. AFTER DECEMBER 9, WE CANNOT GUARANTEE THAT YOUR APPLICATION WILL BE PROCESSED FOR EARLY JANUARY DEADLINES!**

File applications for scholarships! Do not assume you will not qualify. Always apply! Watch for application deadlines and required essays. Two very important dates for you to place on your calendar is:

Financial Aid Workshop at WHS, Wednesday, January 7, 2009 at 7:00 pm, held in the Library.

Special Notes

- ❖ The SAT will be administered at Woodbury High School on Saturday, November 1, 2008. The application deadline is Friday, September 26, 2008. The following local schools will be administering the SAT on Saturday, December 6, 2008: Glassboro High School, Haddon Heights High School, Haddonfield Memorial High School, Kingsway Regional High School (Woolwich), Pitman High School and West Deptford High School (Westville). The application deadline is November 5, 2008. Please see either counselor for information.
- ❖ In order for the counselors to write college recommendation letters, it is imperative that you complete the Senior Information Sheet (Personal Profile) that will be given out in English classes. This form is also helpful when colleges request recommendations for scholarship consideration. Turn this form into the counseling office as soon as possible.
- ❖ Male students who are within 30 days of their 18th birthday should register with Selective Service. This is a federal law. Registering with the Selective Service allows you to receive federal student loans for college, participate in federal job training programs, and work in the federal government. Registration cards are available at the post office or register online at www.sss.gov. The Selective Service web site allows for 17-year-olds to submit their registration information early, thereby maximizing on-time registration.

If that point total arrives before the trip, that student will not be able to participate in the senior trip and **the funds deposited for the trip will not be returned.**

- **Graduation Announcements/ Cap and Gowns** – A representative from Jostens will attend the senior class meeting on October 24. Graduating students will fill out forms for cap and gowns and bring home information on ordering graduation announcements.
- **Class Dues** – all class dues must be paid before you may attend the Senior Trip, Prom, or Graduation. Dues are currently \$35 a year. Dues cover cap and gown, yearbook and senior breakfast.
- **Fines** – no one owing a fine will be able to attend any non-educational activity including Homecoming, Prom, Graduation, and the Senior Trip.
