Dear Parents and Guardians,

It is with great pleasure that I welcome your child to my class. We can look forward to a very exciting and rewarding school year. We are truly lucky to have the opportunity to spend fourth grade together. I believe it will be a rewarding experience for all of us.

In order to provide my students with the positive learning environment that they deserve, we will be following the behavior contract listed below. Also, I want to make you aware of the grading policies which we follow in fourth grade as well as some important events. Please read on...

**Three Questions:** As a part of the parental component of the No Child Left Behind Act, we are asking parents to get involved in their child's education. Please ask your child the following three questions each and every day after school. This will let them know that you believe in their education. Thank you!

**What is something you did your best on today?**

**What did you learn today that you didn't know before?**

**How have you shown good character today?**

### **Behavior Contract**

I have listed below our classroom rules, consequences for misbehavior, and positive reinforcements used to encourage desired behavior. In fourth grade, we will be spending time on good character development as we work with each other to learn and grow. You will see some of these ideas reflected in the rules that we have developed together. We also adhere to the guidelines in the Student Handbook that can be found in the school calendar. Please review the following information and discuss it with your child.

Classroom Rules:

- 1) Listen to directions from adults.
- 2) Be kind to others.
- 3) Keep your hands, feet and objects to yourself.
- 4) Be honest.
- 5) When students are getting smarter (working), be quiet.
- 6) Raise your hand quietly.
- 7) Be fair, take turns and share.
- 8) Try your best and never give up.

A color coded behavior calendar has been inserted into your child's take home folder. The color indicates behavior for that school day. Parents or guardians need to sign the behavior calendar at the end of each week.

Color Code:

- |          |   |
|----------|---|
| Green –  | Excellent Behavior                            |
| Yellow – | Warning                                       |
| Orange – | Consequence (chosen based on the misbehavior) |
| Red –    | Severe Clause / Principal's Office            |

Severe clause will be used in the event of a child defying the teacher, fighting, or disrupting the class in any way that prevents the teacher from teaching and the students from learning. When a student chooses to misbehave, an appropriate consequence will be chosen based on the issue.

These are some of the consequences that may follow:

Time out	Recess detention
Make amends	After school detention
Call home	“Think about it”-student reflection
Letter home-please sign and return	Referral to Principal

Individual Positive Reinforcements:

- 1) Confidence (most valuable)
- 2) Praise (used most often)
- 3) Stand Out Star
- 4) Prize
- 5) Free time
- 6) Fun Friday– for a week of all green or up to three yellow (no orange or red)

**Grading Policy**

Some assignments, such as handwriting practice, will be given one of the following marks:

- √+ Excellent
- √ Good
- √- Needs Improvement

Other assignments may be scored as a fraction. The assignment will be worth a total number of points found in the bottom number. The top number represents the number of points earned by the child. Example: 8/10 This means that the assignment was worth 10 points and 8 points were earned. Finally, tests, quizzes and major class work assignments will be given a letter grade:

A+	97% to 100%	A	93% to 96%	A-	90 to 92%

While assignments with letter grades are weighted most heavily when considering final grades, all work is converted to a percent and contributes to the final grade.

**Important Information**

**Homework**

In order to help keep us organized, your child has a “Take Home” folder. This is to be used to take home completed work and homework (HW). The “KEEP” side is for you to keep at home and the “RETURN” side is to be sent back to me. This folder will be one of the most important tools we use to help us be prepared for class and therefore must be brought to class EVERYDAY.

A homework assignment notebook will be used by students everyday. I will stamp your child's book after they have copied down their assignments. After your child has completed the assignments, PLEASE SIGN THE BOTTOM OF THE SHEET. Everyday that your child has completed the assignment, he/she will get a star on his/her behavior / homework chart. If all HW is completed, stars and prizes can be earned. Also, please feel free to write any questions you may have for me in the "Messages" area on the HW page.

Homework is given daily, usually Monday through Thursday, to reinforce work covered in class. If no HW is given, "No HW" will be written. A quick check of homework each day, by parents and teacher, shows our students that education is important and valuable. Let them know that their success is important to you.

Birthdays: Parents are welcome to send in a treat on their child's birthday. Please send it in with your child in the morning. Summer birthdays will be celebrated at the ½ year birthday. If a student's birthday does not fall on a school day, we can celebrate on the Friday prior or the Monday after.

Lunch / Recess (12:00 to 12:40) and Physical Education: Every day after lunch, students will be going outside for recess, weather permitting. Sneakers are required for recess and gym class; therefore, dress shoes should be changed before going to lunch.
